**Masks** - as you know, face coverings are now mandatory in shops, as well as on public transport. People are also strongly encouraged to wear face coverings in public spaces where there are people they do not normally meet, such as church. However, wearing a mask in church is not mandatory; we are continuing to keep to 2m social distancing within the church at all times.

The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended ó if you do not feel safe coming to Mass please stay at home and dong worry of there is absolutely no requirement for you to attend Mass at all. You will be asked to give your contact details for track and trace purposes. The church toilet remains closed. During Mass, there is no singing, Childrenøs Liturgy, Prayers of the Faithful, peace or offertory procession. When it comes to **communion**, we will all acclaim the presence of the Lord at the priestøs communion by responding Amenøwhen Fr Paul elevates the host and chalice. The peopleø communion is then distributed in silence, with no dialogue between minister and communicant; communion will be given silently, in the hand only, and with the communicant standing. You will be directed to process by the stewards one household at a time whilst maintaining social distance. When you approach Fr Paul, there will be a small table in front of him to aid social distancing: please present your hands palm upwards, one on top of the other, as flat as possible, and with arms extended at full stretch, in order to maximise the distance between you and Fr Paul.

Dial-a-Mass ó the Knights of St Columba have sponsored this initiative which makes Sunday Mass available over the telephone for those who are unable to attend Mass in person and do not have access to the internet or other media platforms. For the cost of a local call, you can listen to Mass by calling 01642 130 120 at any time ó the Sunday Mass is recorded and put on the telephone at 12 midday, and remains there until 11:59am following Sunday. Those who have already used the service have said how it has helped them feel less left out as they do not use computers, and less isolated from their faith and the Catholic community.
