This weekend we celebrate the 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary of **Laudato Si'** - 16-24 May. <u>Laudato Siø</u> tells us that õeverything is connectedö and tragically, the current health catastrophe has much in common with the ecological catastrophe. Both are global emergencies that will affect many people, both directly and indirectly. Despite the current situation, there are still lots of ways we can take action to mark this anniversary, sharing <u>the common prayer</u> and celebrating what we have achieved in our homes, schools and parishes.

**The Ascension of the Lord** is celebrated this Thursday (21<sup>st</sup>). Forty days since Christ astounded His disciples by His resurrection, he returns to His Father in heaven. But before He goes, He must commission His disciples to go forward and spread his teaching, once they have been baptized by the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Ascension is traditionally the beginning of the **Pentecost Novena** – nine days of prayer to prepare for the feast of Pentecost on the following Sunday. **CAFOD** launched its coronavirus emergency appeal on 30 April. Coronavirus has now spread worldwide, with confirmed cases in many countries where CAFOD works. The effects of coronavirus on developing countries are likely to be devastating. Many countries have very weak healthcare systems and will not be able to cope. Families without enough to eat and without access to clean water, possibly living with other diseases, will be particularly vulnerable to coronavirus. It is not just a public health emergency. Many of the worldøs most vulnerable people will lose their jobs and be unable to support their families. The poorest and most marginalised communities, working hard to transform their lives, will be pushed further into poverty. CAFOD is adapting its programmes to help manage the risk of coronavirus in communities and working with local Church aid agencies on the frontline of this crisis. They are already working to get food to where it is needed most; to improve hygiene, handwashing and sanitation in communities and households; producing radio messages, posters and leaflets in local languages on risks and prevention; and training community volunteers to carry out awareness campaigns.

However, we are continuing to face these problems; whilst we are unable to gather for Mass, weekly collections are obviously not taking place. This results in a loss of about £500/week, but our expenditure remains relatively unchanged with tax, insurance, utilities and other bills still to pay.

Our Treasurer is therefore appealing to you if you are able to, to please change your giving to paying by **standing order**. This is safest way to continue giving at this time, and helps us with our ongoing expenditure. If you prefer to use BACS, please make sure your name is included in the description box when you make your payment.

If these methods are not possible for you, or you prefer to give cheques/cash or use the **envelopes**, then just pop them through the door during your daily exercise. To reduce contact, perhaps you could save them up and give three or four weeks at a time.
