## Thoughts from Fr Paul

The Gospel reading today can seem a little long, but like all of the  $\pm$ signsøin Johnøs Gospel, the story is much greater than the events it contains. Reading between the lines, I think John is saying that Martha and Mary are us. As you read the story, which of the two do you most identify with?

And in another way, John is also saying that Lazarus represents all that Jesus deeply loves; õSee how much he loved himö. And what does Jesus want for Lazarus, what does he want for us? He wants us to live, he wants us to be unbound. He wants us set free.

In a time when we are told to stay indoors, to socially distance ourselves, this Gospel has much to say to us. The freedom he gives us is not about our physical situation, its about our hearts and our innermost lives. Jesus raises us up by his love. His love for you is boundless, as personal and as deep as his love for Lazarus. As you accept his love, in prayer, in reflecting on the scriptures, in reaching out to those around you, you experience the freedom that only he can give. And that is good news in these troubled times.

May God bless you, keep you safe, and lead you a deeper experience of his freeing love.

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. *That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.* Let us pray: Pour forth, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy Grace into our hearts; that we to whom the incarnation of Christ, thy Son was made known by the message of an angel, may by His passion and cross be brought to the glory of His Resurrection. Through the same Christ, our Lord. Amen.
